

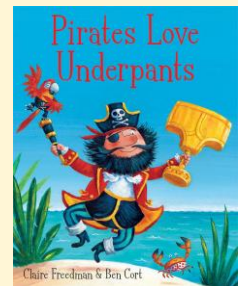
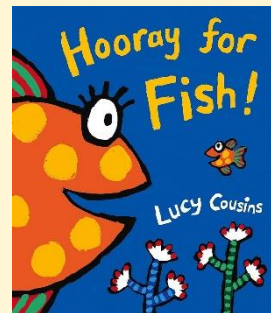
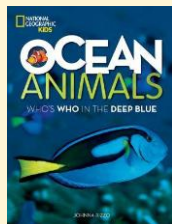
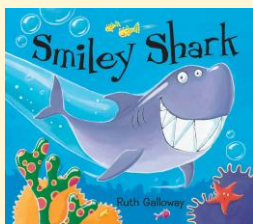


# Nursery Newsletter Summer 1



## HT5 Topic

This half term our topic is **‘Wonderful Water’**. We will initially be focusing on all things ‘under the sea’, using the books ‘Hooray for Fish’, ‘Smiley Shark’ and a number of non-fiction books too. The children will be learning facts, retelling stories, getting involved in lots of ‘under the sea’ crafts. We will also be learning about the signs of Spring outside; experiments with water and being physical developing our balance and strength.



### Homework

As usual the children will be given a sheet of activities in their book bag which you will be able to cross off (one a week). The activities will be very practical hands on activities. These are to be completed at home and you will be able to send evidence on Dojo if you wish.
