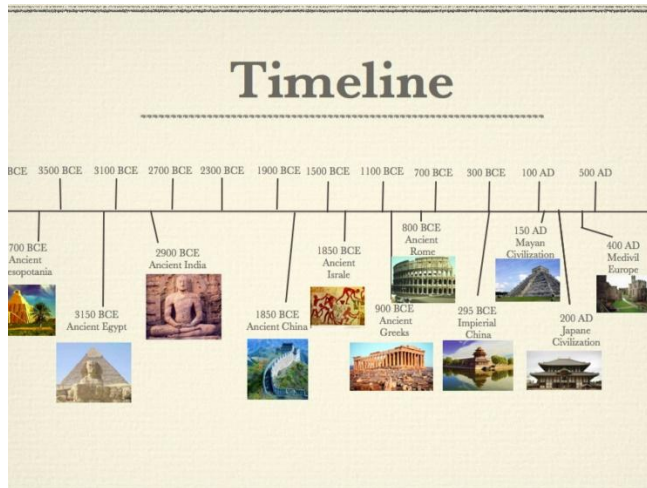

Key Vocabulary	
Athlete	From the Ancient Greek meaning someone who competes to win a prize
BCE	Before Common Era
Citizen	A free man or woman who has the right to vote in their government.
Civilisation	A common way of life to different groups of people
Democracy	When citizens have a say in how their country is run.
Legend	Stories that are based on real events and people
Marathon	A distance of 26 miles travelling on foot, inspired by a Greek soldier who delivered news from the town of Marathon.
Mount Olympus	The highest mountain in Greece, believed to be the home of the 12 Greek Gods.
Myth	A collection of stories belonging to a religious or cultural tradition.
Oligarchy	System of government where a small group of people control everything.
Olympians	Gods and Goddesses OR people who compete in the Olympics.
Olympic Games	Event held every four years at Olympia in honour of Zeus.
Philosophy	A way of thinking about the world, universe and mankind.
Polytheistic	Religious system where people believe or worship more than one God
